### Ash Wednesday is February 14th

Ash Wednesday is 46 days before Easter Sunday. Lent is a 40-day season (not counting Sundays which are always celebrations of the Resurrection). The features of Lent are **repentance, fasting, reflection, and ultimately celebration**. The 40-day period represents Christ's time of temptation in the wilderness, where he fasted and where Satan tempted him. Lent asks believers to set aside a time to focus on Christ's life, ministry, sacrifice, and resurrection. In Aotearoa New Zealand, abstinence from meat, and fasting, are observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting means that we must reduce the quantity of food eaten. Those under 18 and over 60 are not obliged to fast. The three practices of Lent: **Praying, Fasting, Almsgiving** (supporting the less fortunate) are practical ways of building positive habits and reminders that Lent is a particular season for 'creating new habits'. Fasting on days other than Ash Wednesday and Good Friday does not have to be about giving up food. In this technology dominated world it might be fasting from social media for the day, or limiting the number of times we browse, it might be about being aware of our attitudes to others or fasting from gossip.
