1st Reading: Is 60: 1-6: The glory of the Lord shines upon you.

Psalms: Ps 71: 1-2, 7-8, 10-13 **Lord, every nation on earth will adore you.**

O God give your judgement to the kind, to the king's son your justice, that they may judge your people in justice and your poor in right judgement.

In his days justice shall flourish and peace till the moon fails. He shall rule from sea to sea, from the Great River to earth's bounds.

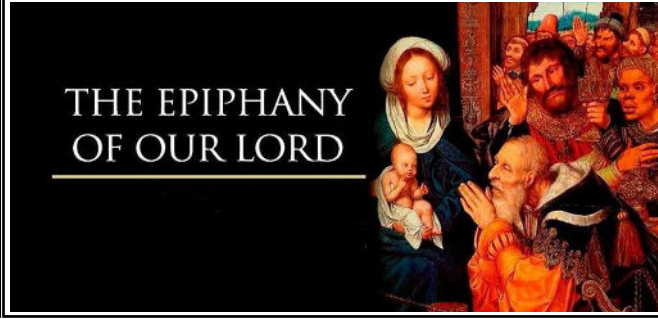

THE SYMBOLIC GIFTS



GOLD

The royal metal; signifies Jesus' Kingship (hence, the gift for a king).



FRANKINCENSE

Symbol of prayer; signifies Jesus as the High Priest/Mediator between God and man (hence, the gift for a priest).



MYRRH

A burial ointment; meaning that Jesus had to die for the salvation of all (hence, gift for one who would die).
